PLANNING BOARD:

Mrs. McCullough reported on the meetings of September 3 and October 2, 2019, so noted and filed in the Village Office. Public hearings were held on the site plan by Solar Generation for a 5 MW solar array on Seber Shores Road and J.D.'s Place tavern and grill at 6059 S. Main Street. No decision was made on the solar project since we do not yet have the engineer signed site plan. The site plan for J.D.'s Place was approved with the usual conditions plus requiring a sign that there is to be no parking at the library lot. The Planning Board approved a modification to an approved site plan by Salmon River Solar (formerly High Peaks Solar). Due to the location of National Grid power lines, the southern lot line needs to be mover 40' to the south. Planning Board meetings are now being held the first Wednesday of the month at the Village Office.
